

Write the vocabulary next to the definition.

- Year** : 365 days or 12 months.
Example: I came to the United States in 2012 and have been a Legal Permanent Resident for 5 years.
- Month** : One of the 12 parts of the year. Most months have 30 or 31 days. February has 28 or 29 days.
Example: We vote for the President in November.
- The Constitution** : The highest law in the United States.
Example: The Constitution is the supreme law of the land.
- Vote** : To choose a leader or law.
Example: We vote for the President every four years.
- President** : The leader of the United States.
Example: The President is the leader of the United States.
- Name** : The words people use to call or talk about you.
Example: In China, people called me Chen Fu-Chiu. My family name is Chen. My given name is Fu-Chiu. In the United States, people call me Fu-Chiu Chen. My first name is Fu-Chiu. I don't have a middle name. My last name is Chen.
- Married** : To be someone's husband or wife according to the law.
Example: I have been married to my husband for three years.
- Permanent Resident** : A person who is not a US citizen that the US government says can live in the United States.
Example: I am a Legal Permanent Resident. I have lived in the US since 2012.
- Citizen** : A person who was born in a country or became a member through the law (naturalization).
Example: My husband is a citizen. We have been married for 3 years. I have been a permanent resident for 3 years. Now I am studying to become a citizen.
