Hello from Teacher Jennifer!

To celebrate Constitution and Citizenship Week 2017, I am releasing **"Mix-and-Match U.S. Citizenship Interviews and Quizzes."**

Teachers can create a variety of practice interviews for their students by pairing an interview with a quiz, then making double-sided copies.

Because many Citizenship classes contain students of various English literacy abilities, I frequently use several levels of interviews (with different civics quizzes on the other side), then distribute the copies according to the students perceived literacy level.

The students complete the info, then are matched up with students of a different literacy level (or different civics quizzes) so that they can orally interview a student with similar, but not the same, information. As students interview each other, they greatly improve fluency, comprehension, and gain CONFIDENCE.

I also teach an ESL 1 class. At this level, I limit the variety of the scripts. First, I would use the same Level 1 interview until the students had been exposed to all five Level 1 interviews. Then I would use two sets of interviews at a time with a variety of the civics quizzes. Again, the students gain fluency, comprehension, and confidence through repeated exposure and systematic variation of the material.

During paired practice, the classroom can become quite noisy. If possible, have the pairs sit as far as possible away from other pairs so they can hear each other talk. I circulate through the practicing pairs to monitor and encourage student progress and to answer questions about pronunciation or definitions.

A special note about mobile devices: I strongly discourage students from using translator app (Distraction!). However, I strongly ENCOURAGE students to record (Tool!) their sessions and share their files with one another. CAUTION: review your school's media policy with your students while emphasizing PRIVACY.

For example, I explicitly state that students may never, ever record a classmate's address or phone number: "It's private, BORING, and eats up your phone's memory." Instead, they can record 1 minute of the more personally meaningful N-400 questions (ex: Travel), difficult Part 12 vocabulary, or civics quizzes: "It's more interesting, plus you will actually listen to the recording again." By the end of class, students not only have a nice audio diary, they can actually hear themselves improve--a great way to crack language fossilization and go on to new life goals with their associated language tasks.

One final note: I wrote this pdf for the expressed purpose to facilitate focused preparation for U.S. Citizenship interview. This pdf is based on, but does not include all the language tasks (grammar, vocabulary, etc.) associated USCIS Form N-400. Because class time is limited and our students' time is precious, I wanted to create a short, paired-based activity during which both partners would feel like they fairly "had their say." These paired "events" are part of the ongoing conversation of American Democracy.

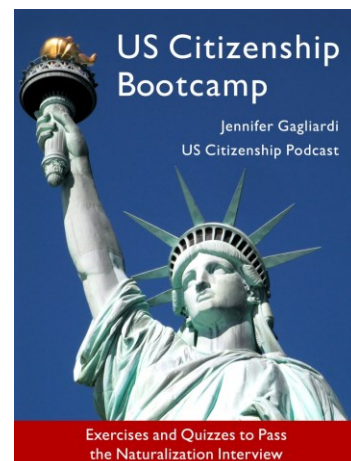
