| Veto | A power of the President to reject (i.e. not approve) a proposed <br> law sent by Congress |
| Cabinet | The group that advises the President |
| Vote | To state one's choice of a candidate (or an issue) in an election |
| Capital | City where the government's legislative body meets |
| White House | The residence and workplace of the US President |
| Washington, DC | The capital of the US |
| Presidents' Day | Federal holiday to honor Presidents Washington and Lincoln |
