	<p>What is “claimed”?</p>	<p>“Claim” is to say something is true even though may not be true.</p>
<p>2.</p> 	<p>Have you ever registered to vote? a) Yes. b) No.</p>	
	<p>What is “register”?</p>	<p>“Register” is to put my name and personal information on an official list of people who can vote.</p>
	<p>What is “vote”?</p>	<p>“Vote” is to choose a new leader or law.</p>
<p>3.</p> 	<p>Have you ever voted in any US elections? a) Yes. b) No.</p>	
	<p>What is “election”?</p>	<p>“Election” is to choose a new leader for a government office.</p>
<p>4.</p> 	<p>Do you have any title of nobility in a foreign country? a) Yes. b) No.</p>	
	<p>What is “title of nobility”?</p>	<p>“Nobility” is to be a member of the king’s (royal) family. A “title of nobility” is a special name or rank.</p>
<p>5.</p>  <p>I can't think! I don't know what to do!</p>	<p>Have you been declared legally incompetent? a) Yes. b) No.</p>	
	<p>What is “legally incompetent”?</p>	<p>“Legally incompetent” is when a judge says that I cannot make important life decisions. A lawyer, doctor, or my family must make decisions for me.</p>
<p>6</p> 	<p>Do you owe any taxes? a) Yes. b) No.</p>	
	<p>What is “owe”?</p>	<p>“Owe” is I must pay the government money.</p>
	<p>What are “taxes”?</p>	<p>“Taxes” are money for the government. The government uses tax money to pay for the government, military, healthcare, schools, etc.</p>
<p>7</p> 	<p>Do you pay taxes every year? a) I pay my taxes every year. b) I pay taxes with my spouse. c) I don't have an income. My family supports me. d) I am disabled. I receive SSI.</p>
